Shriners Children's Philadelphia Hospital

Congratulations to **Leslie D. Stewart, M.D.**, on his election as president of Shriners Children's, as president he also serves as chairman of the Board of Trustees. He follows Imperial Sir Jerry G. Gantt who retired after serving 19 years as a member of the Joint Boards of Shriners Children's, eight of those years as chairman of the Board of Trustees. Dr. Stewart is a general surgeon having received his medical degree from the Medical University of South Carolina. He had his residency and fellowship training in general and vascular surgery at the **Milton S. Hershey Medical Center in Hershey.**



Amer F. Samdani, M.D., was promoted to Chief of Staff, Shriners Children's Philadelphia, effective December 2, 2024. Dr. Samdani follows Scott Kozin, M.D., who is working with the Shriners Children's Medical Group while remaining based in Philadelphia. Dr. Samdani is renowned for his work developing Vertebral Body Tethering (VBT), a revolutionary, fusionless scoliosis surgery. His contributions to pediatric neurosurgery and orthopedics are immeasurable. Dr. Samdani has also been doing surgical procedures at our clinic on the island of Cyprus.

The Puerto Rico Outreach Clinic conducted thus fall was another successful endeavor. Patients seen numbered nearly 300 with 61 being new patients. There were 35 identified as potential surgical patients for our Philadelphia hospital.

The November meeting was slightly condensed because of an executive session being called for all voting and emeritus members present in the building.

RELATIONSHIPS AND PHILANTHROPY

At 45, Mike Smith is a youthful presence among the Zembo Shriners of central Pennsylvania, where the average member age is 74. As an elementary school principal and devoted family man, Mike's energy and commitment have made him a standout leader in the Shrine community.

"I started driving patients to the Philadelphia hospital about two years ago, as my travel schedule allows. I'm involved in so many different things and I attend other clubs and units."

A Decade of Dedication

Mike's journey with the Shriners began about a decade ago. For him, the organization's strongest appeal lies in its relationships and philanthropy.

Mike's impressive and long resume includes Past Potentate (2022), member of the Shriners Children's Philadelphia Board of Governors and being part of the current leadership for the Mid-Atlantic Shrine Association.

"I love the friendships my wife and I have made, and our work with the hospital is incredibly rewarding," he said.

A Powerful Moment

One experience stands out in Mike's mind. While touring the Shriners Children's Greenville hospital with his family, a father approached him, pointing at his Zembo fez. "He thanked me, explaining that his son (then an energetic 2-year-old), was born with club feet, and had received treatment at Shriners Children's. That moment really drove home why we do what we do."

Now registered with the National Register of Historic Places, Zembo Shrine is located at 2801 N. 3 St., Harrisburg, Pennsylvania.



Recruitment and Revitalization

Mike believes that showcasing the fraternity's impact and having a strong social media presence are key to attracting new members. "We need to show people that we're excited about our work and that it's a great time to get involved," he said. Under his leadership, the Zembo Shriners have revitalized their recruitment efforts, even inspiring former members to rejoin.

His motto: help people find what they're interested in.

"If we don't have it, we create it. It's just kind of that personal connection with folks," he said.

He also likes to challenge other members.

"Whenever I make a presentation about Shriners Children's, I ask this rhetorical question: how many of our hospitals or medical facilities have you all visited as members? I'll get a smattering of hands that say one, and I say, 'well, my wife, daughters and I have been to three and counting.'"

A Historic Achievement

As Past Potentate, Mike oversaw the registration of the Zembo Shriners building as a National Historic Place, recognizing its unique Moorish Revival-style architecture. This designation opens up new opportunities for grants and solidifies Zembo Shriners' presence in the community.

Family Support

Through it all, Mike credits his supportive wife and three daughters for enabling his involvement. "I couldn't do any of this without them," he says humbly.

The Imperial Chairperson of Women Impacting Care is Judy Burke. Her theme "On Angels Wings" reflects how it often feels that our patients and families stand on the wings of angels. The wings are often borne by our healthcare team and amazing network of nobles and ladies.

Pediatric burns can be among the most painful and difficult injuries a child can sustain and are frightening and stressful for the who family. Education and prevention are essential in reducing the number of burn injuries sustained by children and adults every year.

February 2-8, 2025, is National Burn Awareness Week, a time set aside each year for organizations and educators to unite in sharing a common burn awareness and prevention message.

That week also kicks off our year long Be Burn Aware Campaign at Zembo, which will focus on the education of preventing burn injuries. Most preventable burn injuries occur in the home. You will find information on basic home safety and tip sheets. The materials are designed to be a resource to firefighters, teachers, parents, grandparents, and others concerned with the safety and well-being of children. A table will be set up at various meetings and activities with educational and informational materials.

Since the 1960s, Shriners Children's has been a leader in burn care, research and education – and burn injury prevention is a key component in these efforts. Let's work together to STOP burn injuries. Please join me! Please be safe – BE BURN AWARE!

- A cruise on the Elizabeth River including a sail by of America's largest naval station is next. You will see many of our country's finest naval vessels.
- Dinner is on your own, near our hotel, there are several restaurants, including Mission BBQ and Chick-fil-A.

Sunday morning, we check out of the hotel after breakfast and go to the Norfolk Botanical Garden to ride their tram around the beautiful gardens. This should be during the height of their Azalea Festival and the blossoms should be gorgeous.

Lunch and dinner will be on your own, on the way home. It will probably be a fast-food stop for lunch and a place like Cracker Barrel for dinner.

Anyone is welcome on this trip. Dress for all the events is casual.

Our Fiscal year of 2024 is behind us, and I can't say I am sorry. We began the year by passing a 'deficit' budget and it did not improve throughout the year. The Potentate did all he could to erase the deficit plus create earnings to help in the future. He, like others in past years, found it to be a difficult road for many reasons. Most of those reasons I have addressed in previous articles.

One of the most important is the lack of support from the membership. We continue to see only about 20 -22 percent of our members supporting the activities and fundraisers such as raffles, circuses, Pep~er, etc.

However, on a very positive note, we congratulate and thank many of the Clubs and Units for stepping up and donating funds for many needy causes this past year. I'm sure without your help we may have had to consider closing our doors because these problems would have limited our ability to continue our daily operations.

About five or so years ago we were in a position to sell our building and that did not happen because of many reasons. I remember at a membership meeting we had an overwhelming vote to refrain from trying to sell our building.

I remind you all that our building has not been renovated or reconditioned so the cost of operating our building has not decreased from the day of that vote.

Unfortunately, all Potentates since that vote have had to deal with some very expensive repairs or renovations just to keep us operating. In the past year alone the Potentate and Divan had to, not by choice, repair our roof at a cost of almost \$180,000 dollars. It may be a surprise to many of you that if we used all of your dues to pay only this expense, we would be short approximately \$65000.00. Paying just your dues will not save this building or allow us to renovate or repair just what needs to be done to continue our operations as Zembo Shrine. In short, we need everyone's support in all of our activities to allow Zembo Shiners to be able to face the future and it will not happen if we continue to only have 20 percent of our members supporting us in our fundraising activities.
